**NEW HAND TOWELS** – 15"x25" to 17"x27"

+++No kitchen, cleaning or microfiber towels, please.

<u>NEW WASHCLOTHS</u> – Do not wash hand towels or washcloths.

**<u>COMBS</u>** – Sturdy, at least 6 inches long. *No pocket combs or picks*.

**NAIL FILE OR CLIPPERS** – No emery boards or toenail clippers.

**BAR SOAP** – 3 oz. or larger only.

+++ No Jergen's or Ivory brand soap, please. Do not remove packaging.

**TOOTHBRUSHES** – Adult size only. Individually wrapped. *Do not remove packaging*.

**ADHESIVE BANDAGES** – 6 per kit; <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" to 1"-size *Common household band-aids*.

We are well into the New Year, but I encourage you, if you have not already done so, to take time to celebrate your unit's 2017 accomplishments. Evaluate your unit's strengths and determine your needs. Reflect how God has been at work in your unit. Giving an account of all the things God has done through your unit anchors your faith and gives hope for the future.

As God's children, the goal is to always to grow and do better. For UMW units, this means we need to plan and organize to promote mission through our activities such as prayer, <u>learning</u>, serving, <u>giving</u>, advocacy, and community building while keeping in mind what God is calling our groups to do. As District Education and Interpretation (E&I) Coordinator, I highlighted <u>learning</u> and <u>giving</u> only because I have the responsibility of encouraging your unit via your unit's E&I coordinator (or President if you do not have an E&I Coordinator) to understand and promote mission giving and mission education opportunities within United Methodist Women.

A couple of tools that can be used to provide understanding, evaluation, and planning with your entire group are Mission Today Unit Criteria and UMW Consolidated President's Report. These two tools can help us determine what we've accomplished, how well we've done it, and areas of future focus. Reviewing the UMW Consolidated President's Report is an excellent examination of your accomplishments and highlights areas where improvement is needed. The Mission Today Unit Criteria can keep you focused on mission throughout the year and is very helpful in planning; its purpose is to:

- Energize United Methodist Women to be more involved in mission through prayer, study and action.
- Increase contacts between units and mission personnel and mission projects so the United Methodist Women understand where their money goes.
- Encourage the use of mission resources through United Methodist Women.
- Expand concepts of mission, including social justice as mission.

Assigning each of the Mission Today Criteria to members of your group and have members report on its progress regularly keeps your team engaged and focused.



# Intercept the Traffickers 2018 United Methodist Women are Standing in the Red Zone

In football, the area between the 20yard line and the goal of the defensive team is known as the "Red Zone." A team that has a high Red Zone percentage because it finishes its drives to score touchdowns on a regular basis. In the fight to end human trafficking, United Methodist Women are moving in the Red Zone poised to score points that Intercept Human Trafficking.

A team that is in the Red Zone is one that has the ball and is less than 20 yards from scoring. Hearing that a team is in the Red Zone makes fans take notice and pay attention to what is happening on the field. The National Football League created a television network called the NFL Red Zone to report on "every touchdown and field goal scored" and the strong offensive drives.

Taking its origins from military terms, the Red Zone means generally close to the enemy." Teams in the Red Zone usually get a touchdown and if not, they get a field goal. United Methodist Women are keeping score; we are counting new beds, new funding for services; and increased prosecutions. We are making offensive plays to Intercept the Traffickers; our efforts have put us in a Red Zone where we are applying our skills of advocacy and action to capitalize on the weaknesses of those who prey on the vulnerable. To symbolize our push to move through the goal posts toward victory against the traffickers, we are moving in the Red Zone. We are putting pressure on the traffickers by raising our voices; United Methodist Women have educated and outreached to over 43,000 people all across America. and shared out accomplishments all over the world. We've helped pass antitrafficking legislation at the Federal level and Safe Harbor laws in state and



supported global partners working to end trafficking which impacts over 20 million people, with 70% of all detected trafficking incidents involving women and children.


#### What You Can Do:
