From the Secretary's Pen Janis Johnson



As I write this article, tomorrow is All Saints Day, which is celebrated in most United Methodist Churches and other denominations. I attended my third funeral in as many weeks, remembering three different, but unique saints. Only one attended my church. The other two, both women, were colleagues and friends during my years of working in the educational system. These events, along with the current situation with the Covid Pandemic, reminded me that we are all on the road to "sainthood"; some journeys are completed; some are still in progress.

Hebrews, Chapter 11, often referred to as the Roll Call of Faith, is one of my favorite chapters in the Bible. Many of the great saints of the ages are listed along with their "claim to fame" in how they exercised their faith. These manifestations of their faith are as different as each person named, but each one possessed and exhibited faithfulness in the challenging circumstances of their individual lives, which all of them faced. Beginning with Abel bringing an acceptable offering, Noah building an ark, Abraham and Sarah trusting God in leaving their home and going to another land and then having a child while well past child bearing years, Isaac blessing Jacob and Esau, Moses refusing a life of ease and wealth and bringing the Israelites out of Egypt, in defiance of Pharaoh's mandates, and going through the patriarchs and matriarchs throughout Israel's history reminds us of the necessity of faithfulness in our own lives.

These days call us to faithful living in ways that might challenge us as never before. And, as in the Roll Call of Faith, those challenges are unique to each of us in our own individual lives. As church leaders, we face many similar situations but, again, each unique because all churches are different. All Saints Day is the beginning of the season of Thanksgiving and Christmas. Planning for worship opportunities in this time of uncertainty presents many unanswered and unanswerable questions. Planning and preparations are necessary while knowing those might be changed or not happen at all. (Again, one looks at the men and women in the Roll Call of Faith and think how many of them experienced those kinds of dilemmas.)

Continuing to read through Chapter 11 of Hebrews, one reads in Verse 33, "By faith these people overthrew kingdoms, ruled with justice, and *received what God had promised them*." Think about that for a minute. It reminds us that God is faithful to complete His work in us, despite outward circumstances. Verse 35b reminds us there will be serious difficulties to overcome at times when the writer says some were tortured, mocked, had their backs cut open, chained, stoned, and killed. It isn't all going to be easy! Living a life of faith requires courage, strength, trust, perseverance. Yet, the blessed words of assurance in Hebrews 11: 39-40 reminds us, "All of these people we have mentioned received God's approval because of their faith, yet none of them received all that God promised. For God had far better things in mind for us that would also benefit them, for they can't receive the prize at the end of the race until we finish the race." Hebrews 12: 1 further clarifies," Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a huge crowd of witnesses to the life of faith, let us strip off every weight that slows us down,..... And let us run with endurance the race that God has set before us."

These saints who we read about in Hebrews, those whose funerals I attended and the saints that will be remembered in All Saints Services have attained that prize because of their enduring and steadfast faith, even in trying times. We too, will attain that prize as we live out the life of faith we are called to during this time of trial and uncertainty.

Blessings to each of you as you do just that and STAY SAFE!




From your **Nominations Chair**:

As you may have noticed in the last *Circuit Writer*, I am now serving as District Education & Interpretation/Program Resources person. That is because National and Conference United Methodist Women no longer have a separate office for Program Resources. For many of our small units that is good. We will have to adjust our thinking and remember that our E & I Coordinator (if we have one) is also responsible for the Reading Program information.

Since our report deadline for 2020 was November 30, we may have been challenged by the fact that most of our units have not met since February of this year. The CPR form is also a little different. The following notes show areas where I, as E & I Coordinator, should be assisting the local President:

Item 1: Mission Studies Completed (either local unit or District sponsored), number in attendance and the action taken. Do NOT list Mission u attendance here. Where appropriate, virtual participation qualifies for completion of a criteria item.

Item 3: Mission Today Unit Report- number of criteria completed- Level of Award achieved.

Item 7: Charter for Racial Justice

Item 8. Reading Program: Information needed- the Reader's full name, number of books by category, and plan level. Submitted to local president by the local responsible coordinator. You will not need to send a report of your ladies who completed the Reading Program to me at the district level as we have done in the past. The District President will forward your Reading Program info to me when she receives the report from your local president.

Moving forward, we'll just do the best that we can and pray that we will be able to meet beginning in January of 2021. I'm sure most of us are following the guidelines outlined by Bishop Graves and our local ministers. If I can be of help, contact me at 850-209-1161.
